Dear Parents, Guardians, of Students in Grades Three, Four, Five, and Six,

A big part of your child's education is teaching them responsibility, accountability, and integrity. With that in mind, the area of homework certainly is one in which we can apply these attributes.

Your child has a homework planner that was provided for them free of charge from our most generous PTG. Students are to enter their homework assignments into it on a daily basis. Then they are to use this planner as an aid to packing up their belongings at the end of day.

If your child forgets to complete an assignment, they will be given one warning. If they forget an additional time that month, they will stay in at lunch time to attend to their work. They will sit at a separate table from the other students, as this will provide them with a quieter and less cluttered area in which to work.

Mrs. Fleet and/or Mrs. Evanchak are often at school until 6:00 P.M. or later. If we are at school, and your child has forgotten to bring something home for an assignment, we will escort your child to their homeroom, unlock the door, and let your child retrieve what they need. Please do not expect Mrs. Fleet or Mrs. Evanchak to be at school at any given day or time. Please call first to make sure someone is here to assist you. We are both normally at school by 8:00 A.M. or so and could also let your child in early to complete their forgotten homework at that time. Obviously, we do not want to make late night or early morning retrievals a habit.

If and when your child needs to come back to school, or come in earlier the next day, they will be asked to sign an index card which will be kept in Mrs. Fleet's office. Mrs. Fleet will write on the index card the date and reason your child needed to come in early or return to school after dismissal. The entry will also be dated and initialed. In this way, we will have an accurate recording.

By your encouragement and good example of punctuality, responsibility, and the importance of a commitment to excellent work and study habits, we hope to work hand-in-hand with you to set the best examples for your son and/or daughter.




